Risk Management Achievement Awards

Workplace Violence & Training Program:

Texas Health and Human Services Commission

Workplace violence is becoming more prevalent, and may be precipitated by internal as well as external elements. The Texas Health and Human Services Commission Risk Management Department developed their Workplace Violence and Training Program in a proactive effort to protect workers, visitors, and clients from violence occurring at the workplace. The program encompasses not only an educational and training component, but engages resources for prevention and control while embracing the key elements of risk management: assessment, prevention, control, and involves both fiscal and community resources.

"Promote Safety" Program:

Rockwall I.S.D.

To create a safer working environment for students and employees, Rockwall ISD developed a "Promote Safety" Program. Safety coordinators from all campuses and departments now attend creatively themed meetings, coordinated to promote specific safety topics in clever (and memorable) ways. In October 2008, popcorn was served while attendees watched "Three Stooges" video clips that emphasized the trio's lack of safety practices and the monthly Safety Spotlight was entitled "Don't Let Accidents 'Pop Up'". Since the program's January 2003 implementation, injuries have decreased and there has been a tremendous increase in safety awareness. Safety coordinators often comment, "This is the best and most fun meeting that I attend!"

Livewell Health & Wellness Program - Enterprise Risk Management:

DFW International Airport Board

Over the last several years, DFW Airport Risk Management has led the development of two tangible initiatives, LiveWell and Enterprise Risk Management (ERM), designed to connect the human and operational components of risk, while also enhancing awareness, assessment, and employee commitment. While the two initiatives are distinct, the implementation of both programs has resulted in a culture of active engagement. LiveWell has led to corporate-wide assessment of employee productivity, health and disability; while the introduction of a formalized ERM framework provided a collaborative management tool for evaluating organizational risks, governance, transparency, and strategic business decisions.

Risk Manager of the Year - Gary J. Urban



Texas PRIMA's 2008 Risk Manager of the Year, **Gary Urban**, brings a unique perspective to risk management developed from a varied career and job assignments. He has been associated with city government since August 1992 — first with the City of San Antonio and, since 2002, as the Director of Risk Management for the City of Waco. Urban has applied his experience and training to develop risk management systems that track everything from driver's license verifications to certificates of insurance that improved the efficiency and functionality of his department. Urban has organized city departments into an effective safety committee that has reduced loss exposure through awareness programs in accident prevention.

During his tenure at the City of Waco, Urban has applied his training and experience from his past careers to develop programs and training that reduce or eliminate loss exposures. He consistently applies risk management techniques that save taxpayers money, while creating a safe work environment for the city's employees. Urban supports and mentors other risk managers as well as supporting Texas PRIMA as a past officer and Board member. Recently, he took the lead to revise the Chapter's bylaws.

Prior to entering the world of risk management, Urban completed a career of more than 25 years with the U.S. Air Force. He began his service as an Air Intelligence Technician and had tours of duty in Texas, Nebraska, and Alaska, in addition to two years in Vietnam.

Urban's other accomplishments include a B.A. in Geography/History from the University of Nebraska; and an M.A. in Public Administration from Webster University. He earned the Associate in Risk Management (IIA-ARM) designation; and is a Licensed Risk Manager in the State of Texas. Urban received the Texas PRIMA Chapter Service Award in June 2008.

Risk Management Associate of the Year - Barbara Russell

Texas PRIMA's 2008 Risk Management Associate of the Year, **Barbara Russell,** has been with the risk management team at the Garland Independent School District (Garland ISD) since September 2001.

Garland ISD has approximately 7,500 employees and is the largest employer in the City of Garland. Employee safety is always at the forefront of this risk management department. One of Russell's top priorities is the safety of approximately 400 commercially licensed drivers that transport about 17,000 students twice a day. Garland has a fleet of 660 vehicles of which 282 are school buses.

The programs that Russell has put in place include continuing safety meetings with drivers, accident remediation training, and working within the district and city to create safer traffic conditions. Due to these programs, accidents have decreased appreciably and an increased awareness has been placed on accident prevention.

Russell is also responsible for insuring that the district is in compliance with the U.S. Department of Transportation regulations. Besides the fleet safety responsibilities, Russell works with the safety specialist and the workers' compensation specialist at Garland ISD to provide a safer workplace for their employees.

Russell was a legal assistant for five years and before that a claims adjuster for five years. She has a property and casualty adjuster's license and received her Associate in Risk Management designation in May 2007.


